Goal Setting Meetings: using SKOOL LOOP.

On

- Tuesday 26th March (Rātu 26th Poutu Te Rangi) and
- Wednesday 27th March (Rāapa 27th Poutu Te Rangi)

we will be holding our goal setting meetings. This is an opportunity for you and your child to meet with kaiako to discuss their mahi so far this term and goals for the next term. These meetings are 10 minutes only and it is important that times are adhered to in order for everyone to have the opportunity to meet with kaiako.

The children will have goals prepared to share with you but kaiako will love to hear what your specific goals for your child are as well. If you have anything other than learning and learning goals to discuss with your child's kaiako we please ask you to make another appointment on another day.

If you have not already downloaded the **Skool loop app** to your phone/ipad/tablet do so now.

This is not live to Parents yet as there is a technical hitch, you will receive a notice on both Skool Loop and Hero when this is available for your bookings.

Paid Union Meeting:

Also on Rātu 26th Poutu Te Rangi (**Tuesday 26th March**) the staff will be attending a paid union meeting in the afternoon. We ask for children to be collected form school at 12:30 on this day please so that the teachers can attend this hui.

We will have minimal supervision available for the afternoon for those who are unable to make arrangements however this will be very minimal.

Please let your child's teacher know what the arrangements are for your child so that they know where your child is to be at 12:30. (Picked up, walking home where they will have supervision at home or remaining at school to be supervised).

Flying Wasabi is still available for tamariki who may need to remain at school, order through their facebook site etc as per usual.

After School Care will also still operate should it be required.

Thank you for your assistance in having kaiako able to attend this meeting.

Health and Safety:

We have increasing numbers of children arriving at school well **before 8:30am** each morning. Teachers do not take on duty of care until 8:30. We have a large number of children arriving between 8:00 and 8:15am daily and more between 8:15 and 8:20.

Until 8:30 tamariki are not able to enter buildings as there is no one present to supervise them. The Road Patrol on Lamond Street also does not operate until 8:30am to assist children crossing the road at the busier morning times.

Jump Jam 2024

Last week we had 78 tamariki express interest in taking part in the 2024 Jump Jam Competition.

We will have three teams that will be determined before the end of term however if there is anyone in our wider community who may be interested in taking a team please let us know. We can support you and provide all the information etc if you are keen. It is a very competitive competition but it is also a lot of fun. We would love to have another coach to provide this opportunity for the tamariki.

Kapahaka 2024:

Our ropu is now up to 124 tamariki! This is fantastic! (Busy, but fantastic).

A post was put on Hero last night for whānau with tamariki in Kapahaka regarding a poi making afternoon on **Sunday 7th April** (Rātapu 7th Paenga Whāwhā). Please complete the form in the Hero post so that we know if your child will be joining this session and if you are able to come and assist (no experience necessary - a lot of learning for lots of people). Many hands make light work and with approximately 150 practice poi needed all hands are welcome.

If you did not receive the post through Hero, your child is not on the kapahaka roll.

Vehicles:

Just a quick reminder that the staff car park is for staff vehicles only unless you have a mobility pass displayed or have an agreement for 2024 with the school leadership team for drop offs and pickups.

The Drop off zone is just that - a quick drop off or pick up. Adults should not be getting out of vehicles to help children in this area. Children should also be entering and exiting the vehicle on the footpath side of the vehicle. We have had a high number of children almost hit by vehicles coming through the drop off as they cannot be seen when they are popping out into the driving space between vehicles.

Traffic in this space should be moving steadily with no one parked or stopped for any more than 1 or 2 minutes.

Thank you for helping to keep the traffic before and after school flowing.

We are learning the alphabet, animals, counting and ways to greet and farewell


in sign. We all know our name and can introduce ourselves in sign language too. We can't wait to see how much we learn over the course of this year.

MITEY We have been looking at how feelings make us different from others and how they determine what we think, say and





showing 4 different emotions. We are including our feelings each day when we

Communicating with Whānau:

We have a range of communication methods for keeping you up to date with what is happening at Salford School.

<u>Hero -</u> All formal communication will come through Hero -newsletters, notices and information (processes and procedures). You have access to your child's attendance, reporting graphs, and formal curriculum learning information posts. These all accumulate overtime so as your child progresses through Salford School their progress in their learning can be seen over time.

Skool Loop —Sports notices will be shared through School Loop. Enrolments for sports can be completed directly on this app. You can also communicate your child's absence, make after school care arrangements to school through Skool Loop as well.

<u>See-Saw</u> - The classes use this to share day to day

learning activities and happenings with you. Seesaw has been invaluable over the last two years through lockdowns and distance learning times. Should we need online and distance learning again this app will be used for this as well as.

Teachers have appreciated being able to share what is happening in class with you easily on this app and the children are becoming more proficient at creating posts to share their own learning with you as well. The children are very

proud of being able to do this and enjoy your feedback on their posts. With parents and whanau not able to be on the school grounds, Seesaw has definitely helped everyone stay connected and see what is happening regularly in the classroom.

Facebook - This is our sunshine, rainbows and lollipops page! We will be sharing lots of great things that happen at the school, events and opportunities as well as photos of just the 'everyday' things as well.

<u>School Website</u> This is where you can find all information about the school (We have a new website up and running but some areas are still under construction)

<u>myKindo</u>—This is the PTA App being used. Order school lunches, make payments, purchase items for discos and PTA Fundraising events, ... it's all here to see and pay, any time, anywhere.

Your PTA Administrator can set up whatever needs paying or completing through Kindo. This myKindo app will display it for you to take action.


School Interviews

Regular parent interviews are important as it allows for a dedicated time to update on children's progress, voice concerns, make plans and discuss the child's progress. Schools can load available interview times for different teachers onto the app where parents can then book a convenient time. Our school interview online booking system ensures an easy way to check for teacher's availability and book a time for interviews.




TO JOIN YOUR SKOOL LOOP APP NOTICE GROUPS, SIMPLY FOLLOW THE STEPS BELOW:




