Dear Parents and Caregivers

Kia ora. What gorgeous weather we have had in the last few weeks! Our Year 6s had their camp at Bannockburn recently and got well and truly spoiled by the lovely weather. A huge thank you to teachers Megan Roulston and Kris Gray, for their work in organizing the camp, and thank you to all the camp mums and dads who did a superb job. We were all very impressed with the children's willingness to give all the camp activities a go (with the exception of eating roast pumpkin on the last night ...).

PB4L (Positive Behaviour for Learning)

As mentioned in an earlier newsletter Salford School is introducing PB4L this year. It is a long term programme (e.g. 3-5 years to introduce fully). PB4L's success does rely on the understanding and support of parents and caregivers so we will keep you informed as we work through the stages.

We are working steadily through setting up systems this term. We worked first on identifying positive behaviour expectations for children. We are using the following statement with the children;

We are respectful, we are responsible, we are caring and we work hard. This is derived from the key values selected by parents and staff in surveys last year. We have also developed a schoolwide behaviour matrix which lists the positive expectations for each setting e.g. what is expected in classrooms, in the playground, on trips, on wet lunchtimes etc.

One of the key principles in PB4L is acknowledging children for good behaviour. Teachers have their own

reward systems in their classrooms. We also have schoolwide systems e.g. House points and the Top Class Award. One new thing we are trying is Values Certificates which will be awarded at assemblies (midterm and end of term) to the two children in each class most demonstrating the key behaviour expectations or making big improvements in this area. We will be presenting the first set of values certificates next week.

What's happening?

<u>Athletics practices</u> are well underway for the upcoming athletics sports on 28 March....

<u>Local MP, Sarah Dowie</u> visited the school this week and spent time in a Q and A session with a senior class and read a book to a junior class. It was great to have Sarah visiting and getting involved with the children.

We also had a visit by students from

Meeker Middle School in Tacoma, USA. They are on their annual exchange with James Hargest College and it was a nice opportunity for our children to make connections with them...

The NZ Playhouse performed Puss in Boots for the school on Wednesday. We aim to have four performances each year to expose children to different aspects of the performing arts world.



Thank you to Emma and Ryan for greeting Sarah and showing her around our school.


