The Salford School Board of Trustees is very keen to build strong relationships with our school community. We are holding a get together for Board members to meet with our school's Maori parents and caregivers here at school on the evening of

Tuesday 4 April. Invitations will be emailed/sent home to families with children who are enrolled as Maori. Please contact the office if you would like to know more about this event.

PB4L (Positive Behaviour for Learning)

We had our first Values assembly last week to acknowledge those children who have consistently displayed the core values of Respect, Responsibility, Caring for Others and Perseverance. It was so nice that so many parents made the effort to be at assembly. Our next Values assembly will be at the end of the term.

Part of the PB4L initiative is using data to target our teaching. Analysis of the first six weeks has revealed that over 90% of children are incident free after 6 weeks and only 5 children out of 240 have had more than one incident. Verbal or physical reactions to conflict are our chief concern. We will be focusing on how to manage conflict over the second part of the term.

Cybersafety

Please note the upcoming Cybersafety session for parents and caregivers with John Parsons on 3 April from 3:30 to 5:00 in the Hall. This is a great chance to learn about what risks your children are exposed to online. We will be very happy to keep an eye on your children in the playground while you attend.



John will be working with the senior classes during the day to help them become more informed about the risks and responsibilities of being on the internet.
