


Term 3 Week 7 5 September 2014

Chinese New Year is a traditional and very important Chinese holiday. It was originally a festival to honour ancestors as well as holy or sacred beings. It is also known as the Spring Festival, which is the literal translation from the Chinese name. It is also referred to as the Lunar New Year because the Chinese calendar is lunisolar.

A lunisolar calendar uses both the moon phase and the solar year. Chinese New Year is the longest festival in the Chinese calendar.



Research states that children that watch movies or gaming over their age restrictions have more issues controlling their anger and behaviour. Is your child a poor sleeper? Research also suggests that age appropriate media reduces sleep difficulties in children. The content of what children are exposed to plays a big role in the health and well being of children.

Games and Movies are colour coded for age appropriateness for children like a traffic light

Green - Go Ahead, this means any age is able to view or play this game or movie

<u>Yellow- Slow Down</u> and think is this appropriate for my child's age? **Parental guidance is recommended.**

Red -Stop! Check the age restriction. Only people over the age of the age restriction are able to watch or play this game.

Restrictions apply in the home and at school as well as stores and cinemas. It is illegal to supply media to anyone below the age restriction that is stated, penalties of fines up to \$10,000 or 3 months in prison for an individual, or \$25,000 for a company.
