PB4L (Positive Behaviour for Learning)

We are continuing on our PB4L journey started last year. Our key values are Respect, Responsibility, Caring for others and Perseverance. These values are used in the following statement; **We are respectful, we are responsible, we are caring and we work hard.** Schoolwide systems to acknowledge expected behaviours include;

- House slips which are presented for children displaying the school values
- The Top Class Award each week for the class most displaying the Values.
- Values Certificates which are awarded at Values Assemblies (midterm and end of term) to the two children in each class most demonstrating the key behaviour expectations or making big improvements in this area. The first Values Assembly will be held on 9 March.

Learning Support

Supporting children who need some extra help is a big part of what we do at Salford. We have a number of learning interventions to support children in their learning and are adding to them as more funding becomes available. Learning support in 2018 will include;

- the Mathematics computer programme for the senior classes
- Reading Recovery for 6 children each day
- ALL (Accelerated Learning in Literacy) which will be held in Y3-6 classes in Term 2
- ALIM (Accelerated Learning in Mathematics) which will be held in Y3-6 classes in Term 3
- Teacher aides assisting children's learning in every class for part of each day
- Literacy Support in Years 2-3 classes with a part time teacher

Learning is a partnership between home and school and we expect parents/caregivers to be doing their bit at home as well to reinforce learning at school.

Help with reading

If you are able to help with hearing children's reading for 10-15 minutes before school in the morning, please make contact with any of the teachers or Mrs Devine at the office. It doesn't have to be every day. I'm sure you would find this a very satisfying experience.

Cybersafety

John Parsons, cybersafety educator, will speak to children and parents about how children can protect themselves from cybercrime while online. John will be here on Wednesday this week. He will talk to Year 4-6 children in the morning and parents at 3:15 in the library. (N.B. Children could play in the playground while you attend). We are very grateful to Invercargill East Rotary for funding John's programme.


Term 1 Inquiry:
