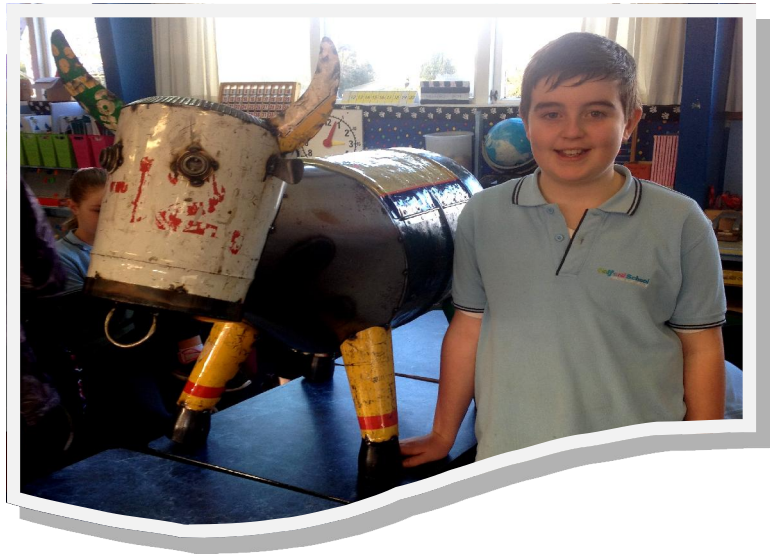

AFTER SCHOOL CARE CHARGES
