On Wednesday, 60 students aged 9, 10 and 11, staff and parent helpers travelled to Bluff for the Phoenix Zone Cross Country.

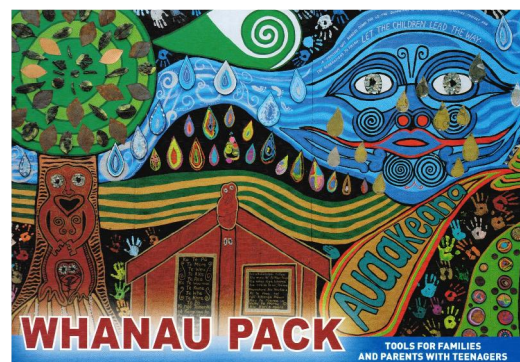

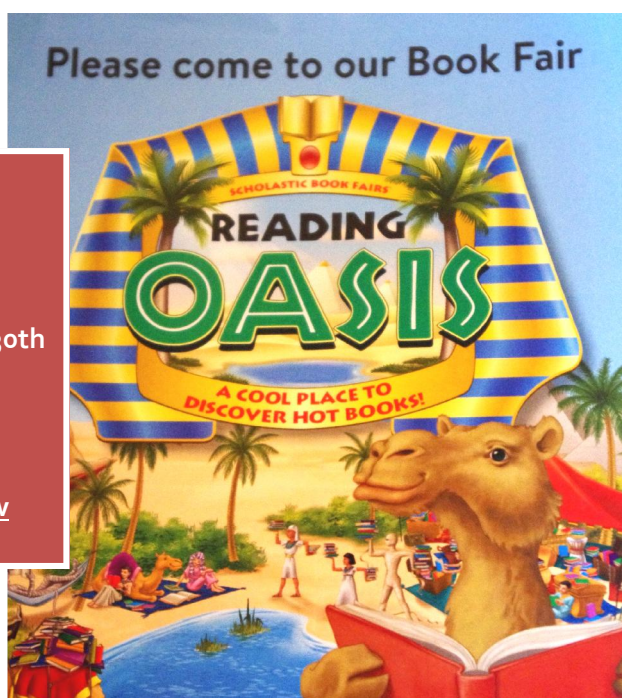
