Fields of Remembrance commemoration for Salford School.

I am sure that you are aware that ANZAC Day 2015 is the centennial recognition of the landing of the ANZAC troops on the 25th of April 1915 at Gallipoli.

The Fields of Remembrance Trust and the Ministry of Education have formed a partnership to support all schools in commemorating the sacrifice of those early soldiers through warfare or disease.

We have been given a kit of resources to allow us to create a small Field of Remembrance close to our flagpole in the week prior to ANZAC Day this year. This week is the first week of

Term 2, so we need to get organised now.

We have been given the names of men who lost their lives during the Gallipoli campaign, who have a geographic relationship with Invercargill and Southland, to display on 30 small white crosses.

We are able to substitute names for soldiers who have a family link to our school, so if you have such a relation from World War I and would like the recognition on our Salford Field of Remembrance, could you please email your relatives **name, rank and number** to admin@salford.school.nz.

We will hold a special ANZAC Service on Thursday the 24th of April with more information on this coming out later.

Health Consultation: I am required to consult the School Community every two years about the Health component of the NZ Health and Physical Education Curriculum. The meeting this year will be on **Tuesday 31 March at 7.00pm in the Staffroom**, or classroom depending on numbers attending.

The Health & PE Inquiry theme for this year is **"How do the choices we make influence our well being?"** I will publish a summary of class level 'content' around this theme before the 27th of March to allow you to decide if you need to come to the meeting.

The 2016 Inquiry theme is **"How does our body work"** and this programme fits within the NZ Police programme called "Keeping Ourselves Safe", and we would look to the Police School Liaison/Education Officer presenting this in 2016.

MONDAY—Pita Pit orders—to the Office by 9:00am—**Cost \$5.00.** *Envelopes for ordering at the Office.*

HOME “HEAT UPS” - Students can bring from home lunch items which require warming up any day of the week, but we request, that to encourage healthy eating, “pies” are restricted to a Thursday as noted above. All “Heat Ups”, must be in a container suitable to be placed in a pie warmer or microwave heating, clearly name, and in the Hall kitchen by 9.00am (Before School).

We do not want children to bring the “3 Minute” Noddle’s” to school for lunch, as these require hot water and we do not have tables for students to sit at during lunch time. A hot container of noodles is a real safety issue. We have had to deal with scold and burns, and ask your assistance in ensuring there is no food bought to school that requires “hot water”.

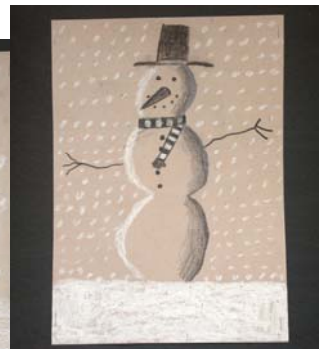
